•Dear Middle and High School Families,
During most of the 2026–27 school year, students in grades 6–12 will participate in a field study, or pilot, of a new English Language Arts curriculum called [Lenses on Literature](#). Lenses on Literature is designed to help students strengthen their reading, writing, communication, and critical-thinking skills through engaging, grade-level texts and learning experiences.
Last year, we surveyed parents and caregivers about what they value in their students' English Language Arts experiences. Your feedback helped guide our curriculum review and was used in selecting Lenses on Literature for this field study.
