During most of the 2026–27 school year, students in grades 6–12 will participate in a field study, or pilot, of a new English Language Arts curriculum called Lenses on Literature. Lenses on Literature is designed to help students strengthen their reading, writing, communication, and critical-thinking skills through engaging, grade-level texts and learning experiences. Last year, we surveyed parents and caregivers about what they value in their students' English Language Arts experiences. Your feedback helped guide our curriculum review and was used in selecting Lenses on Literature for this field study. Throughout the year, teachers and the district will gather feedback and review how well the curriculum supports our students. Families are welcome to contact their student's ELA teacher at any time with questions, observations, or feedback. Thank you for partnering with us as we work to provide meaningful and high-quality learning experiences for every student. • A reminder that phones should be put away during the school day, and students may not record or photograph other students on campus without permission. • STAR assessments help us see your academic growth, celebrate your progress, and identify areas where you may need additional support.
